The Island Says Goodbye to Roosevelt School

As we all know Roosevelt Elementary School will soon be closing. Originally established in 1923 and called the Third Ward School, until renamed after WWI for President Roosevelt.



Roosevelt School has taught countless students. Though the doors won't be opening this fall, those touched by the school are left with many memories—some have been shared below and on page 6.

Every December the students at Roosevelt make poinsettias and walk through the island spreading cheer by taping the poinsettias on neighbor's doors. It is one of the neighborhood's favorite traditions. —Erin Elliot, December 2022.

I remember those "early" years for me when we still had lunch in the gym!!The little "kitchen" off the gym was used to get the food ready. My class had Phy Ed right after lunch recess. I always felt badly for my kids when they'd have to be down on the floor for warm ups and there might still be some errant peas or other food scraps missed by the custodian! —Mrs. Reader, 1986

I remember the end of the year Girl Scout activities in the gym. We crossed the bridge to our next level and shared cake, songs, and conversation inside before running outside to the playground. The playground was the older metal one that sat behind the building where the gardens now grow. —Beth Schmid

Backyard Chickens on the Island—Here to Stay



Welcome to the Island, ladies!

Yes, they're here now in Menasha, too.

Ordinance O-1-23 was introduced in February 2022 by Menasha Aldermen Austin Hammond, 4th District, and Tom Grade, 6th District. The ordinance was finally passed - but not without a little clucking beforehand.

The motion was originally deadlocked with a 4-4 vote, resulting in Mayor Don Merkes breaking the chicken shuffle, with an aye vote and the passage of the motion with a final vote of 5-4. Jubilation in the Chamber! Ordinance 0-1-23 was passed February 20, 2023.

Menasha has joined the flock, with Neenah being the first in the Twin Cities (Neenah-Menasha) to approve chickens. In comparison, Little Chute remains firm with a no-chicken policy but Fox Crossing, Harrison, and Appleton do allow the cluckers. Doty Island will now welcome chickens to its menagerie of Island animals. But let's first clarify some of those old assumptions about chickens.

Did you know the term for a laying chicken is a layer? No, really. (Adult laying hen.) Hens will lay eggs with or without a rooster as long as they have the correct nutrients. The eggs are considered infertile with no rooster to assist. (No rooster, no chicks.) We won't

go into the biology of it but please see your local middle school science teacher for further explanation.

The chickens now allowed in Neenah-Menasha are all lavers, as dictated. The chicken ownership are firm: No chicken coop in the front yard; no breeding of chickens allowed; no eggs or chicks can to maintain a cohesive group. no killing of chickens within either city limits. Also, a license characterized by soft, low, must be issued to have chickens on your property. In Menasha the license will cost \$7/flock. Neenah limits their residents to four chickens per flock. Menasha will vote on a proposed six chicken limit at the April 15 Council meeting.

But one may ask, "What about the noise?" As Alderman Hammond points out, the initial

concerns about noise pollution are not well-founded, "Chickens in conversation do not match the louder decibel rating that barking dogs emit. Additionally, hens clucking can be surprisingly comforting, says Dr. Lori Marino, in her 2017 article "The restrictions and rules for all this inconvenient truth about thinking chickens." Chickens are highly social beings, she states, and the buk-buk-buk is part of their need be offered for sale; and there is The contented chicken noises of a community of foragers are tuneful gurgles and grunts (McGrath et.al.).

In Island Plaza, located at 407 First wood projects on his Facebook Street, Todd Nerenhausen has his studio. It's not obvious from the street view, but Todd's business is custom furniture, cabinets, and construction of food trucks. Todd has a diverse range of talents and it comes from his upbringing on Doty Island and the time he spent in Fort Lauderdale, FL.

My first time teaching 1st grade was at Roosevelt School. I went to pick up my students from recess; they weren't there. Looked all over the school. Miss Rose Ann Blair hid them under her 5th grade students' desks. I looked into her room, she looked over to me and just kept teaching. Students just kept working. Finally, I got back to my classroom and the kids came marching in, happy as larks. Rose Ann was smart, strict, and fun. —Sue Vine, 1980-81

I was in 5th grade, on Friday, November 22, 1963, when Principal Loren Graunke entered the classroom and took aside our teacher, Miss Lichtenberg. She broke into tears and announced that President Kennedy had been assassinated. We gathered our belongings and went to the gymnasium, where we all knelt on the floor and prayed. We were allowed to leave school early that day. The fact that our teacher gathered us together to pray, is a memory I will cherish and never forget. - Monica (Schweikl) Taylor


DIDC Name Change Proposal


